About This Report

This annual Management Report of Fund Performance of Canso Credit Income Fund (the “Fund”) contains financial highlights for the year ended December 31, 2025 but does not contain the complete financial statements of the Fund. Investment objective

The Fund's investment objective is to (i) maximize total returns for unitholders while reducing risk and (ii) provide unitholders with monthly cash distributions by taking long and short positions primarily in corporate bonds and other income securities.

Investment Strategies

The Fund's portfolio manager is Canso Investment Counsel Ltd. (“Canso” or “Portfolio Manager”), a company under common control as the Manager. The Fund's holdings are not restricted by credit ratings. In addition, Canso engages in short selling of securities primarily to hedge credit and interest rate risk. This

allows the Fund's portfolio to be positioned more defensively in both rising interest rate environments and credit downturns.

Risks

The risks of this Fund remain as discussed in the Fund’s most recently filed public disclosure documents.

Results of Operations

The Fund returns for the year ended December 31, 2025 were 4.40% for Series A and 4.41% for Series F.

At the end of the year, the Fund held approximately 29.9% of its net asset value in short positions. These primarily consisted of short positions in Government of Canada bonds and U.S. Treasury bonds.

The net assets of the Fund were approximately \$148.3 million at December 31, 2025 from \$148.6 million at the beginning of the year. There were net redemptions of approximately \$2.1 million and cash distributions of \$4.6 million during the year.

During the year, the Fund paid a performance fee of \$4,851 (including HST). A performance fee, if applicable, will be equal to 20% of each of Class A and Class F’s outperformance of the FTSE Canada All Corporate Bond Index

There were no unusual changes to the components of revenue and expenses of the Fund and there were no unusual events or transactions, economic changes or market conditions that affected performance beyond what would be reasonably expected or as described below.

The Fund did not borrow money during the year except for immaterial short-term cash overdrafts.

Recent Developments

During the year, markets defied expectations as trade policy disruptions, idiosyncratic credit events, and delayed U.S. economic data heightened uncertainty. Beneath the headlines, a broader theme of caution persisted, reflected in consumer confidence surveys, subdued corporate hiring intentions, and ongoing concerns surrounding tariffs, immigration, and fiscal policy. Labour markets in both the U.S. and Canada remain fragile, while core inflation continues to exceed central bank targets.

Throughout the year, the Bank of Canada (the “BoC”) reduced the overnight interest rate by 100 bps to 2.25% as trade conflicts weighed on economic activity. Employment growth slowed, influenced by lower immigration levels and the impact of U.S. tariffs on select sectors. Despite these pressures, consumer spending has remained resilient. The Canadian dollar appreciated against the U.S. dollar but remains below historical averages, which may contribute to higher import prices. The BoC has signalled that it expects to remain on hold for an extended period as monetary policy hands off to fiscal policy.

During the year, the Federal Reserve (the “Fed”) cut the upper bound of the Fed Funds Target Rate by 75 bps to 3.75%. The Fed’s stance reflected caution amid mixed economic data, including rising unemployment, even as core inflation remained above target.

The Fund maintains a sizeable position in liquid government securities, reflecting elevated credit and interest-rate risks. Securities rated AAA/AA represent 50.8% of the portfolio. These higher-quality, liquid holdings position the Fund to take advantage of future opportunities in the credit markets at more favourable valuations. The Fund’s 17.4% allocation to securities rated BB or below remains relatively low, highlighting the limited opportunities in lower-quality credit due to persistently tight spreads.

During the year, the Fund added the following corporate bond issues: 407 International Inc. 4.11% October 3, 2035; Pacific Life Global Funding II 4.195% July 29, 2032; Hydro One Limited 3.9% November 21, 2033; Royal Bank of Canada 3.985% July 22, 2031; New York Life Insurance Company 4% June 17, 2032; MassMutual Global Funding II 4.127% July 15, 2032; and MetLife Inc. 4.149% June 6, 2033. Purchases were funded through the sale of Canada bonds, NHA MBS issues, and select sub-investment grade securities.

There have been no changes to the Manager or Portfolio Manager, or change of control of the Manager, or of the Fund. There have been no actual or planned reorganizations, mergers or similar transactions involving the Fund.

Effective June 30, 2025, James McGill ceased to be a member of the Fund’s Independent Review Committee (“IRC”). Effective June 30, 2025, Mary Anne Wiley was appointed as a member of the IRC.

Related Party Transactions

The Manager provides or arranges to provide for the provision of all general management and administrative services required by the Fund in its day-to-day operations, including but not limited to, calculating and reporting the net asset value of the Fund and its classes, preparing all offering documents, unitholder recordkeeping and other administrative services. The Manager receives a management fee for these services. The fee is calculated based on a percentage of the net asset value of the Fund as disclosed in the Fund’s most recently filed Annual Information Form.

The Fund paid \$1,113,025 (excluding HST) in management fees to the Manager for the year ended December 31, 2025 (December 31, 2024 - \$1,076,989).

The Manager is also entitled to receive a performance fee from the Fund (the “Performance Fee”) under certain conditions as described in the Fund’s most recently filed Annual Information Form. For the year ended December 31, 2025, the Performance Fee accrued payable by the Fund was \$4,293 (excluding HST) (December 31, 2024 - \$1,470,964).

The Portfolio Manager is responsible for all investment advice provided to the Fund including providing investment analysis and recommendations, making investment decisions and arranging for the acquisition and disposition of portfolio investments. Portfolio management fees for the Portfolio Manager’s services are paid from the management fee. The Manager will also pay to Canso a percentage of any Performance Fee that the Manager receives from the Fund, such percentage to be agreed upon between the Manager and the Portfolio Manager from time to time.

The Manager paid \$522,846 (excluding HST) to the Portfolio Manager for the year ended December 31, 2025 (December 31, 2024 - \$1,679,390) including performance fees, if applicable.

The Independent Review Committee (“IRC”) continues to oversee transactions involving securities traded among mutual funds, closed-end funds, managed accounts, or pooled funds managed by the Manager or its affiliates. In such cases, the

Management Fees

The Manager provides or arranges the provision of all general management and administrative services required by the Fund, and as described in the section “Related Party Transactions” above.

In consideration for such services, the Manager receives a monthly management fee, based on the net asset value of each Class, calculated daily and payable monthly. The Fund pays a management fee at a rate of 0.75% per annum for Class A and Class F units.

The Fund may also pay a performance fee under certain conditions as described in the Fund's most recent Annual Information Form.

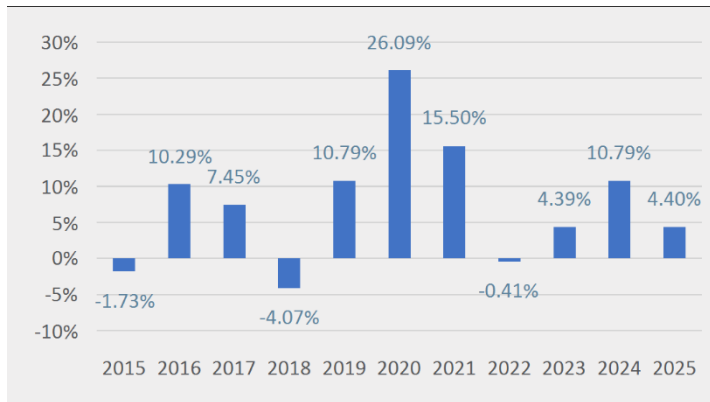
Past Performance

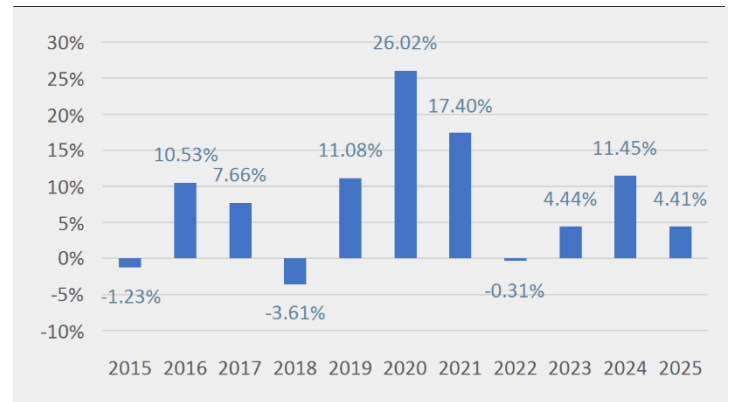
Prior to June 25, 2015, the Fund used a fund-on-fund investment strategy whereby the Fund gained exposure to Canso Credit Trust through a forward agreement. On June 25, 2015, as a result of changes to the Income Tax Act (Canada), CCIF changed its investment objectives, ceased to use a fund-on-fund strategy and began investing in securities directly. In addition, prior to July 1, 2020, the Fund paid servicing fees at 0.40% per annum on Class A units. On July 1, 2020, the Fund discontinued the payment of servicing fees. These changes could have affected the performance of the Fund or a class of units of the Fund had these changes been in effect throughout the performance measurement period.

Year-by-Year Returns

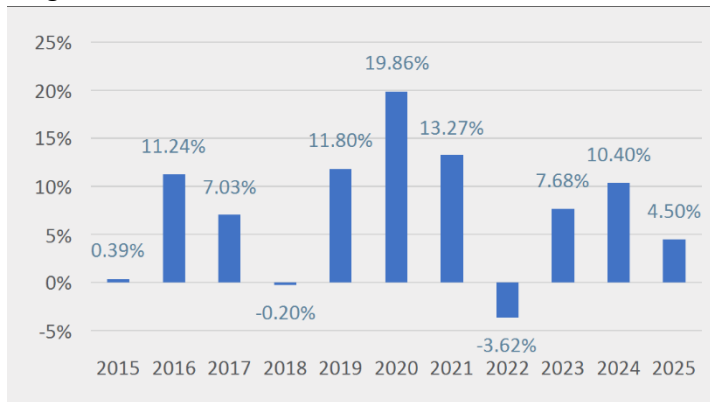
Class A



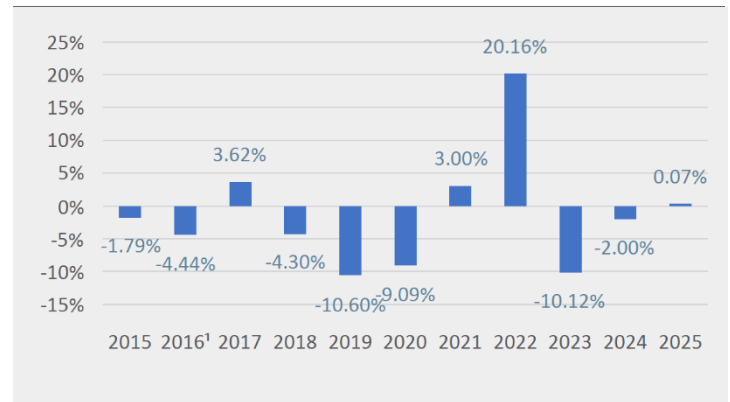
Class F

Annual Compound Returns

The following table shows the Fund's annual compound return for each period indicated, compared with the FTSE Canada All Corporate Bond Index (the "Index"). The FTSE Canada All Corporate Bond Index measures the performance of the Canadian corporate bond sector. It is comprised primarily of semi-annual pay fixed rate corporate bonds issued domestically in Canada. The returns of the Index are calculated without the deduction of fees and expenses, whereas the performance of the Fund is calculated after deducting such fees and expenses.
