Investment Objective

The Fund’s objective is to provide above average, long-term total returns consisting of interest income and some capital gains by investing primarily in fixed income securities.

Investment Strategies

The Fund’s portfolio manager is Canso Investment Counsel Ltd. (“Portfolio Manager” or “Canso”), a company under common control as the Manager. The Fund’s holdings are not restricted by credit ratings. The Portfolio Manager engages in opportunistic buying and selling of primarily corporate bonds using a contrarian approach. Canso believes that it is able to access market segments and exploit inefficiencies in the corporate bond market that are not available or apparent to most investors, due to its proprietary credit analysis and trading expertise.

Canso tends to take a “bottom up” approach to portfolio construction, focusing on security selection. The exposure to credit risk in the Fund will depend on the phase of the credit cycle and the bottom up valuation of individual securities. When credit spreads are very tight, Canso’s valuation focus will tend to concentrate the Fund on high quality corporate bonds which will reduce its credit risk. When credit spreads are wide, Canso will tend to exploit wide credit spreads to add to positions at attractive prices.

While the Fund will consist primarily of corporate bonds and other credit instruments, it is expected that Canso will, from time to time, hold other securities in the Fund as a result of exchanges, recapitalization and other reorganizations. The strategy employed by Canso has historically included convertible and distressed bonds. From time to time, Canso may also purchase other securities such as convertible bonds, equities, or income trusts. The Fund may invest up to 20% of its assets in these types of securities from time to time. The Fund may from time to time also include a significant amount of cash and/or cash equivalents. More details are contained in the Fund’s simplified prospectus.

Risks

The risks of this Fund remain as discussed in the Fund’s most recent simplified prospectus.

Results of Operations

During the period, Canso employed its bottom-up process to buy and sell securities for the Fund. The Fund’s positioning and performance is consistent with the Fund’s fundamental investment objective and strategies.

The Fund returns for the period ended June 30, 2026 were 0.92% for Series A, 0.92% for Series A5, 1.20% for Series F, 1.20% for Series F5, and 1.63% for Series O.

The net assets of the Fund were approximately \$22.5 billion at June 30, 2026 from \$21.6 billion at the beginning of the period. There were net subscriptions of \$956.3 million during the period.

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There were no unusual changes to the components of revenue and expenses of the Fund and there were no unusual events or transactions, economic changes or market conditions that affected performance beyond what would be reasonably expected or as described below.

The Fund did not borrow money during the period except for immaterial short-term cash overdrafts.

Recent Developments

During the period, global markets were defined by a striking disconnect between resilient risk assets and a volatile macroeconomic backdrop. Despite geopolitical tensions in the Middle East, persistent inflation, and a shifting narrative toward higher rates, both credit and equity markets remained remarkably resilient, as demonstrated by tight credit spreads, massive debt issuance, and blockbuster IPOs. Historically tight credit spreads appear increasingly at odds with interest rate volatility, persistent inflation, and growing late-cycle pressures. While fundamentals remain strong across select industries, others are beginning to weaken as economic headwinds build.

Throughout the period, the Bank of Canada (the "BoC") held overnight interest rates at 2.25%. The BoC has continuously highlighted weak economic activity in Canada and ongoing uncertainty surrounding U.S. trade policy. The BoC has also clearly signalled that it will remain on hold for an extended period as monetary policy passes the baton to fiscal policy.

During the period, the Federal Reserve (the "Fed") held the upper bound of the Fed Funds Target Rate at a level of 3.75%. Newly appointed Fed Chair Kevin Warsh reaffirmed the Fed's dual mandate and emphasized the committee's goal of restoring price stability. Markets interpreted the messaging as hawkish, with additional rate hikes in the second half of the year now fully reflected in U.S. swap market pricing.

The Fund maintains a sizeable position in liquid government securities as both credit and interest rate risks remained elevated. The weight to Government securities in the portfolio is 28.3%, while the weight to securities in the portfolio with ratings of AAA/AA is 53.1%. The higher quality, liquid positions will allow the Fund to take advantage of future opportunities in the credit markets at more favourable valuations. The weight to securities in the portfolio with ratings of BB or below is 15.8%, this relatively low weighting is indicative of the lack of opportunities in the lower quality segment of the credit markets by virtue of tight credit spreads.

The Fund maintains a sizeable position in liquid securities such as government bonds and NHA MBS securities as both credit and interest rates risks remain elevated. The higher quality, liquid positions will enable the Fund to take advantage of future opportunities in the credit markets at more favourable valuations.

During the period, the Fund added the following investment grade corporate bond issues: Alphabet Inc. 4.00% May 15, 2033; Bank of Montreal 3.539% March 3, 2032; Bank of Montreal 4.166% June 15, 2034; Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce 3.65% January 13, 2032; Honda Motor Co. Ltd. 3.539% September 23, 2030; Honda Motor Co. Ltd. 3.547% February 25, 2031; Manulife Financial Corporation 4.458% PERP; New York Life Insurance Company 4.20% May 9, 2033; TC Energy 3.732% PERP; Toronto-Dominion Bank 3.687% January 9, 2032. The Fund also added to select sub-investment grade positions: Avis Budget Car Rental 8.375% June 15, 2032.

The top three securities that contributed to the Fund's performance over the period were: Manulife Financial 5.883% June 19, 2081, Manulife Financial 4.1% March 19, 2082, and Bank of Nova Scotia 2.7% July 27, 2081.

Canso's guiding principle in the management of the Fund is to take risk when adequately compensated, which extends to both interest rate risk and credit risk. At June 30, 2026, the Fund's duration was 4.1 years which is below the benchmark duration of 5.7 years.

There have been no changes to the Manager or Portfolio Manager, or change of control of the Manager, or of the Fund. There have been no actual or planned reorganizations, mergers or similar transactions involving the Fund.

There were no changes to the membership of the Fund's Independent Review Committee ("IRC").

Related Party Transactions

The Manager provides or arranges to provide for the provision of all general management and administrative services required by the Fund in its day-to-day operations, including but not limited to, calculating and reporting the net asset value of the Fund and its series, preparing all offering documents, unitholder recordkeeping and other administrative services. The Manager receives a management fee for these services. The fee is calculated based on a percentage of the net asset value of the Fund as disclosed in the simplified prospectus.

The Fund paid \$98,768,155 (including HST) in management fees to the Manager for the period ended June 30, 2026 (June 30, 2025 - \$84,107,735).

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The Portfolio Manager is responsible for all investment advice provided to the Fund including providing investment analysis and recommendations, making investment decisions and arranging for the acquisition and disposition of portfolio investments. Fees for providing these services are included in the management fee. Portfolio management fees for the Portfolio Manager's services are paid from the management fee.

The Manager paid \$46,472,646 (including HST) to the Portfolio Manager for the period ended June 30, 2026 (June 30, 2025 - \$39,528,994).

The Independent Review Committee ("IRC") continues to oversee transactions involving securities traded among mutual funds, closed-end funds, managed accounts, or pooled funds managed by the Manager or its affiliates. In such cases, the Manager must adhere to its written policies and procedures presented to the IRC and provide periodic reporting in accordance with National Instrument 81-107.

Management Fees

The Manager provides or arranges the provision of all general management and administrative services required by the Fund, and as described in the section "Related Party Transactions" above.

In consideration for such services, the Manager receives a management fee, based on the net asset value of each Series, calculated daily and payable monthly. The Fund pays a management fee at a rate of 1.25% per annum for Series A and A5 units and at a rate of 0.75% per annum for Series F and F5 units. No management fee is charged to the Fund with respect to Series O units, but investors are charged a negotiated management fee.

Service fees or trailing commissions of a maximum of 0.50% per annum are paid on Series A and Series A5 units to dealers. This comprises 40% of the management fee of Series A and Series A5 units, respectively.

5) The management expense ratio ("MER") is based on the total expenses of the period ended, including the Fund's proportionate share of the MER, if any, of any underlying fund in which the Fund has invested, and is expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset value during the period.

6) The Fund's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the Fund's portfolio manager manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the period. The higher a fund's portfolio turnover rate in a period, the greater the trading costs payable by the fund in the period, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the period. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of a fund. The portfolio turnover rate is calculated based on the lesser of purchases or sales of securities divided by the weighted average market value of portfolio securities, excluding short term securities.

7) The trading expense ratio ("TER") represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset value during the period. Where the Fund invests in any underlying fund, the TER includes the Fund's proportionate share of the commissions of any underlying fund in which the Fund invested.

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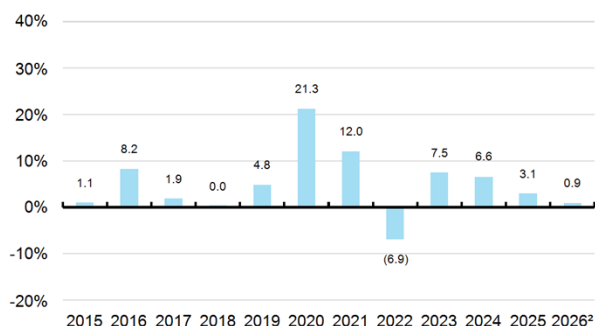
Past Performance

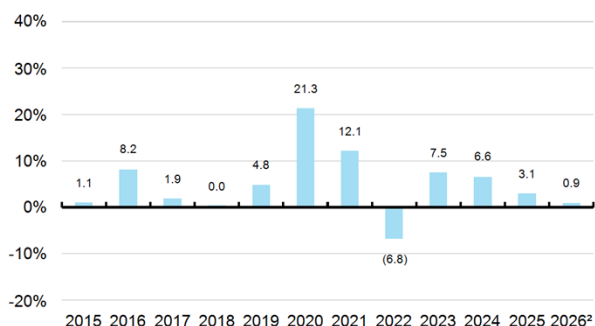

Year-by-Year Returns

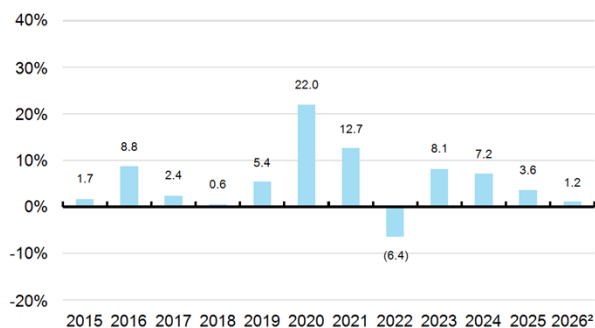

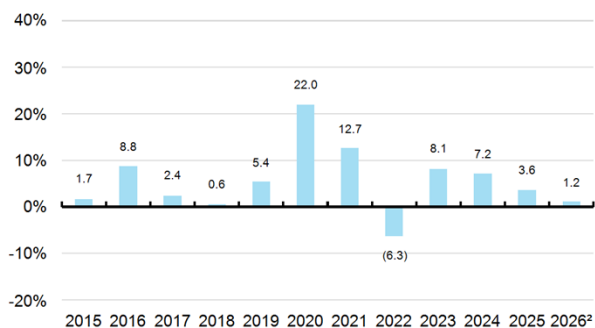

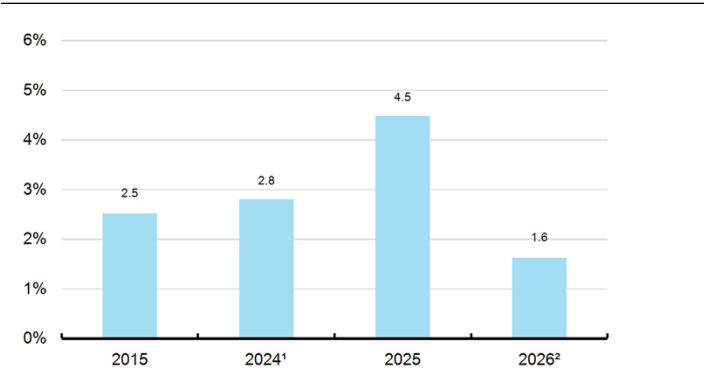
